

Important Changes Bank Phishing - 6/09/2019

This phishing message was reported on the weekend, which appears to read like a message from a bank. Aside from the lack of any bank branding whatsoever, the message reads like an unauthorized notice, then delivers a service message about account maintenance and asks for verification via email link. Not knowing which bank this is, another red flag should pop up, as hovering over the link reveals a non-US entity. Furthermore, a compromised user is the sender – clearly not any sort of banking official. Please delete!
